We try to be as free and easy as we can in running the Club but sometimes a problem occurs and we have to react – hopefully without becoming too draconian! A number of events recently have drawn the committee's attention to the problem of members booking for a rally and then deciding to leave early. Obviously, in a genuine medical emergency this is unavoidable, but in ordinary circumstances, if a rally lasts for a certain length of time you are expected to stay until the end. The obvious exception is when the rally is advertised on a come and go as you please basis.

We understand that the whole point of a motorhome is the freedom to move on when it suits. However can I ask you to consider the other side of the equation? The chances are that the rally marshal has negotiated a special deal on site fees, and the site owner has done this because he expects to have so many vehicles staying for so many nights – possibly at a quiet time of year. If ralliers leave early, the site's income is reduced causing embarrassment to the marshal and the Club. The site owner might be within his rights to look to the Club to make up the difference. Ultimately it could mean that we would not be welcomed back to that site.

As a result of the problems which have occurred, the committee has decided to monitor the situation from the reports which are submitted after every rally. If a pattern develops then we will have to take further action, but we all hope that common sense will prevail.

On a happier note, as this is the last issue of the newsletter in 2013, Angie and I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and hope that you enjoy the festivities wherever you are.

Antenna Alignment 'APP'.

I've found a useful app to help align your TV aerial to a television transmitter.

Download the app "Antenna Alignment" from the app store to your iPhone or iPad at a cost of only £0.69. On opening a list of transmitters will appear; select a transmitter from the list, then use the compass view to point your aerial in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow.

The top rated transmitter may not necessarily be the best one for your location, as terrain and local structures are not taken into account and may affect which transmitter is best for you. The 'app' will also tell you whether the signal is a vertical (v) or horizontal (h) polarisation; simply requiring a 90deg twist to conform..

Cab Radio Switching Off: The automatic 'switching-off' of the cab's radio has been an annoying feature for many members, however there is now good news.

- **Peugeot:** We now have an authorised solution as detailed in Ideas Sheet 230. I've already had a great response for copies, but if you have not already requested a copy, e-mail me or send a SAE.
- **Mercedes:** Unfortunately there is no such option for the Mercedes cab radio.

Air Top Unit Suspension: If you have Air-Top Unit Suspension, as fitted on newer Peugeot van conversions, ensure you check the pressures regularly. If the pressure drops too low the 'inflated rubber suspension' could be damaged by abrasion. In such case the damage may not be covered by warranty.

Peugeot Recall:

I am aware that there is a Peugeot 'service issue' recall with regard to the lowering and raising the spare wheel on some Boxer chassis. This is not a safety issue and only involves some chassis.

Owners will receive a letter from Peugeot advising them to contact their local Peugeot Dealer if their vehicle is affected. Dealers will also receive an automatic alert if the vehicle gets booked in for a service or

repair – it will appear on their screens as soon as they input the chassis or registration number.

Winterisation: Now that winter is fast approaching, I hope you will be taking precautions in a timely manner. Perhaps one or both of the following Ideas Sheets may be useful:-

Website Update Notification:

There are now 654 members (50% of total) who are on the list for notification of Website updates. They are listed in 9 groupings each group being less than 100.

This met Virgin's (previous) limits of the maximum of 100 e-addresses per e-mail. This allowed all 9 groups to be advised of the update over one evening.

However Virgin has changed the limits (*unannounced*) to 250 emails per day. This means that notification is now spread over 3 days, sorry!

I think there is a way around this restriction – and I will it adopt if successful.

Personal: Update on our new Virgin broadband. I still have a good speed with no 'dropping' out'. However the WiFi range was extremely poor and I could not update the Club Website. I spent hours & hours with innumerable Virgin staff (*including long periods with 2 in India*), all unsuccessful, and Virgin ultimately gave up. Finally our son (*software engineer*) stepped in and resolved both issues, so all's OK. Letter sent to Virgin, awaiting response!
