The preparation for the 2017 National Rally is well underway with the National Rally sub-committee beavering away behind the scenes to ensure the weekend runs as smooth as possible and everyone can have an enjoyable time

As I stated in last months newsletter the trips this year are to Southwell and the Lincolnshire Road Transport Museum and for those who know nothing about them I have written a bit about each below

Southwell (Saturday Trip)

Southwell is arguably one of the prettiest towns in Nottinghamshire, situated on the River Greet and just a short drive from Newark . The stunning Minster is over 900 years old and has one of the finest Norman naves in the country. There is Burgage Manor where Lord Byron lived for some of his life, The town has links with the civil war and Charles the first. There is also the Southwell workhouse a place you would have ended if you had no money, now maintained by the National Trust. Southwell is also the birthplace of the Bramley apple and the original tree still stands there but sadly not for much longer as it suffering with old age.

The Lincolnshire Road Transport Museum (Sunday Trip)

The museum is an independent museum founded by four businessmen in 1959. They all had a keen interest in motor transport vehicles and went to great lengths to build and foster the initial collection which has grown to what they have today. They actually display some of the older original petrol vehicles in the country. Some of the vehicles will not look that old as you would have used them traveling to work or on holidays during the 60s and 70s while others would have been used by our parents and grandparents
Besides the various vehicles on display and being restored are a number of artifacts such as road signs, Transport related adverts and model toys which you may well remember playing with in your childhood. As you will see in the workshop the work is carried out by volunteers who use their skills to restore the various exhibits to pristine condition using the original methods

2. A person can only accept appointment as a proxy on behalf of a maximum of two members.
3. To appoint a proxy using this form, the form must be received by the Club Secretary on any day between Mondays to Friday inclusive and no later than 48 hours before the time appointed for the meeting at which it is to be used.
4. The proxy must be signed by the relevant member and by the proxy being appointed.
5. Any alteration to the proxy form must be initialled by the member.

NOTES ON PROXY FORM 2017

1. Appointing a proxy will not preclude you from personally attending and voting at the meeting (in substitution for your proxy) if you subsequently decide to do so. However if you wish to revoke your proxy at any time, you must inform the Club Secretary in writing before the meeting starts.

REPRESENTATION BY PROXY 2017

This is the eighth year of the introduction of Proxy Voting, and I therefore hope that this article will explain to old and new members the way proxy voting works for the A.S.O.C. Some who are reading this will see that I have cribbed parts from the previous years.

When the Club became a Company Limited by Guarantee in 2002. It followed the requirements of the Companies Act 1985 and 1989. These Acts did not allow for proxy representation in a company with no share capital.

When the Companies Act 2006 was passed to consolidate the above Acts, cut down on red tape and simplify the running of companies, it introduced proxy voting.

Section 324 of the Act, Right to appoint a proxy, states “a member of a company is entitled to appoint another person as his proxy to exercise all or any of his rights to attend and speak at a meeting of the company”. This section overrules anything stated in the articles of Association. So at the AGM in 2010 we changed our Articles of Association to comply with the Act.

What this means for the Club, is that if a member wishes to appoint a proxy, they have to fill out a proxy form and get their proxy to sign the form, and then send it to the Club Secretary before the due date.

As this is a legal requirement you are hereby notified that you have a right to appoint a proxy to participate in the 2017 General Meeting, on your behalf, using the Proxy Form enclosed, which must be received at the address given on the proxy form before 10.30am Thursday 27th April 2017.

May I make three things clear, the person who is nominated, as the proxy does not have to be a member of the Club. I know that this may seem strange, but that's the way the Act is written.

Secondly that you cannot just put down Chairman, Secretary etc on the form, they will be considered invalid. Thirdly it must be remembered that no proxy can act for more than two members. That is why they must sign the form.

As you can see this change though important, will not alter the running of the Club. It only means that the AGM the voting procedure will take a little longer while we count the votes.

I, for one, sometimes lapse and when I do clean them the 'muck that comes off is surprising, making a big difference to their cleaning function.

AL-KO Air Suspension:

After reading two recent newsletter articles, regarding AL-KO air suspension deflation problems, Steve Gilliard has written to me.

Steve had a similar problem, which he blamed on rough roads in Scotland, and Auto Sleepers duly replaced them. He recently decided to check the new fittings, just in case they were wearing again, and noticed that the units are now fitted with shorter bolts that point away from the rubber bellows so could not rub against them.

He recommends that: - "Members who have AL-KO units fitted to their van visually inspect them to ensure that there are no bolts anywhere near the bellows. It is not a complicated inspection as they can be seen, with a torch, by simply kneeling at the side of the vehicle." I would recommend this simple check.
