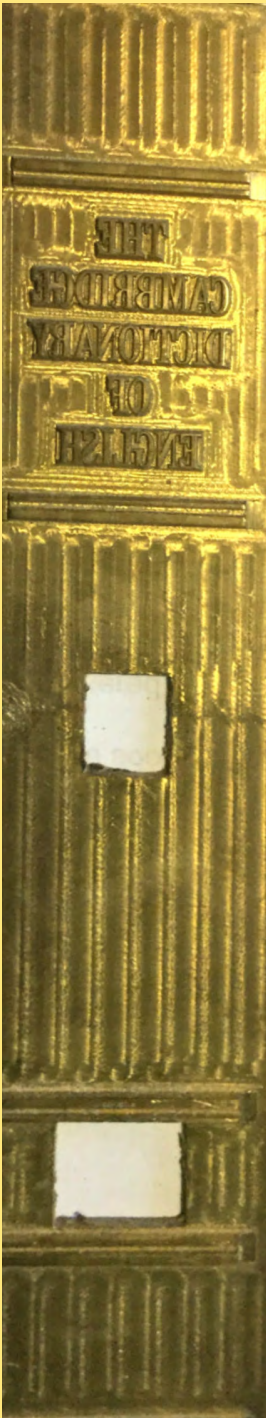

LPG Forecourt Supplies

I get asked for my opinion on the seemingly dwindling forecourt supplies of LPG for motorhomes with under-slung tanks.

While I do not see an immediate problem, it may be a concern that as more and more of the infrastructure needed for electric vehicles gets planned and installed, LPG customers may become forgotten.

In that context, what can we do? I see suggestions on the forums that include using a gas bottle and regulator connected to your external BBQ point in an emergency. If you are tempted to do this, please be aware that the gas system on your motorhome is not designed to operate in this way. You will very likely be in breach of regulations covering gas installations. If there is an accident while using an appliance with a gas cylinder externally connected, you may be liable for any loss, damage or injury caused. Your insurer will very likely deny any claim you might make.

However, all may not be lost. It has been suggested to me by my Brother-in-Law, Brian Graves (10589) that in the end kitchen of his Bourton, there is space for the construction of an approved gas locker, sealed to the habitation space, in the cupboard next to the habitation door. Because this cupboard is on an outside wall, it could then have an external locker door fitted for access and the necessary gas drop points fitted in the floor. While this might be expensive it does seem, on the face of it, technically feasible. I am not familiar enough with the layout of other models to comment further as I am the previous owner of a Stanton and now a Bourton – both with identical end kitchens. Perhaps anyone who is interested in how this can be achieved in their motorhome can join me in a discussion, by email technical@asoc.uk.com

I must stress that any modifications to the gas system in your motorhome must be carried out by an approved gas installer AND your insurance company informed.

CPAP power

One request for advice came to me this month about the use of an inverter to power a CPAP machine that works on mains power, when no hook-up is possible. Some of you may already know that a CPAP machine is worn by the sleeper all night to assist with a condition called Obstructive Sleep Apnoea where the subject would normally stop breathing for short spells during the night, disturbing their sleep. The van in question is a 1993 Executive. Here is my explanation...

Go and talk to your CPAP Provider. My wife Jean, our Membership Secretary, also uses a CPAP machine. She went to the Clinical Measurements Department at the Royal Derby Hospital, where she gets it serviced etc and told them that she needed a 12V version for when we go camping. They gave her a 12V "Brick" power supply like the mains one to use when motorhoming off grid. This has a cigar lighter plug for the 12V supply. They also gave her one with battery clamps for

connecting straight to a 12V battery. I stress the term “gave”, there was no charge. Hooray for the NHS! The machine now runs off the TV 12V cigar lighter socket irrespective of whether we are on hook-up or not.

With an inverter, you will find two things:

1. They all use a lot of power to change the 12v DC to 240v AC. They are not very efficient. That means they waste a lot of energy. The drain on your Leisure battery will be very high and when it becomes exhausted during the night, it will continue discharging past the point where the battery may become damaged, and at best have its life shortened. Off grid, recharging your leisure battery may be a challenge.

2. It will be noisy. The inefficiency generates heat that the electronics needs to get rid of. The only practical way is with a fan. The cooling fans in these inverters work hard to dissipate the heat and in turn make quite a lot of noise.

I cannot recommend the use of an inverter in our motorhomes for anything other than short periods such as charging a mobile phone or a laptop, and only then while it can be supervised so it will not damage your leisure battery by driving it into the ground. It is worth remembering that a lead acid battery should not be regularly discharged below 50% of its maximum capacity or the number of charge/discharge cycles (the battery’s life span) will be seriously reduced. Allowing it to go completely flat may prevent the charger from charging it back up again.

For our motorhome, I fitted an additional leisure battery to double my capacity and together when operating the CPAP machines’ 12V power supply gives us about 4 nights CPAP use “off grid”, but for that, we have solar panel charging during the day and we are very careful, not using the TV or lighting the van up like Blackpool illuminations.

Clearing blockage on waste tank drain

Lionel Allery (9111) asked me about the drain on his waste tank...

“Can you please recommend cleaning chemicals suitable to clear blockage. Waste still dribbles out and I have used hot water and detergent with little improvement.

I am now too old now to get underneath and investigate myself!

We have been fastidious with filter in kitchen sink since we bought the van from new.”

I wholly sympathise with the sentiment about crawling under the motorhome these days. I don’t like getting old, but the alternative is not very appealing!

I have no experience with this issue. Many forum contributors insist you should not put chemicals in your water tanks. I had a Stanton and now a Bourton and I know that, apart from the level sensors, all the tank materials and pipework are plastic, so will have no issue with any of the proprietary drain clearing products. There are a couple of big “HOWEVERS”.

The Association of Caravan and Camping Exempted Organisations (ACCEO)

ASOC is a member of ACCEO but I suspect that very few ASOC members know that or what ACCEO is and what it does for ASOC.

When ASOC runs a rally on land that is not a permanent licensed caravan site, it is doing so with a temporary (for 5 days) Caravan Site licence and planning permission as a Permitted Development. To be able to do this ASOC has applied for and been granted an Exemption Certificate under terms of the Caravan sites and Control of Development Act 1960, ASOC has to apply to have the certificate renewed every five years.. ACCEO is a body that represents and supports some 150 social clubs that hold Exemption Certificates and who, between them, have around 80,000 individual members – a membership that makes ACCEO a significant stakeholder in the world of caravan and camping activities.

It will be helpful to understand why, and how, ACCEO was formed. The Government called a meeting at Beaulieu in 1976 to see how the 1960 Act was working and what further legislation, if any, was required to shape future needs. After a couple of years the process that was started at that meeting produced a proposal to limit the number of Exempted Organisations that could exist and the number of rallies that they could hold, particularly in National Parks.

In 1978, two organisations were formed to counter this proposal: The Confederation of Caravan and Camping Clubs and The National Federation of Caravan Owners Clubs. They met some success challenging the proposal but decided they would be more effective as one organisation and in 1985 merged to form ACCEO. The formation of ACCEO was welcomed by the (then responsible for caravanning and camping) Department of the Environment and a series of regular meetings between the parties commenced. Following the 1997 election, the new Department of Environment, Transport and the Regions challenged the operation and legality of ACCEO member clubs with respect to rallies. With professional legal representation, ACCEO successfully defeated that challenge on behalf of its members, but lesson learnt, ACCEO still maintains a 'fighting fund' lest similar circumstances arise again.

ACCEO committee members are volunteers drawn from ACCEO member clubs who, between them, have a vast experience of forming and running caravan and camping clubs and of all the relevant rules and regulations. ACCEO has excellent relationships with the Caravan and Camping Club and the Caravan and Motorhome Club and, along with them liaise on behalf of member clubs with the (now responsible) Natural England. Club personnel and circumstances are regularly changing (particularly in the past months of pandemic) and ACCEO is available to give advice or guidance or even to be just a sounding board.

ACCEO offers services to member clubs, for example, if a club who can only rally for five days wants to hold a longer rally, that can be facilitated by ACCEO and ASOC has benefitted from that in the past. If a club wants to run a rally in a National Park, specific permission has to be sought from the National Park and ACCEO is one of the few organisations who can make that application.
