NATIONAL RALLY & AGM COSTS FOR 2023 EXPLAINED

As you will see from the application form in the News, the prices for the 2023 National Rally have increased.

The prices for the 2022 National Rally were agreed in 2019 for the 2020 National Rally, but Newark held the price over for the 2022 National Rally due to Covid, this has made the increase more noticeable.

TO GIVE YOU SOME COMPARISONS.

Two people staying at Moreton in Marsh, Caravan and Motorhome Site on the same dates as the National in 2023, would pay £163 without any entertainment. For one person it would be £111.50.

If you had gone to the Lincoln End of Season Show in September 2022, the cost would have been £75 for the 4 days without electricity or entertainment.

So, as you can see, the cost for the 2023 National represents extremely good value, so please attend to meet old and new friends, and to have an enjoyable four days.

TECHNEWS with Dennis

Motorhome Security

A member, who is a new owner of a Broadway, enquired about appropriate levels of security. Here is my response, which I thought I would share and invite comment...

Thanks for your enquiry. There are many opinions on this, and what I offer is a personal view and an example of what level of security I choose to use. Principally, your first question should be "who am I protecting?"

What I mean by this, should you be unfortunate enough to have your vehicle stolen or damaged in an attempt to steal it (or from it), how much upset and inconvenience will it cause you and how much will adding layers of security get in the way of your enjoyment of your Broadway.

The principal line of "defence" is your insurance policy, which should cover any loss or damage, provided there is no negligence contributing to the loss (ie leaving your keys accessible or the van unsecured). The Broadway is built on the Peugeot Boxer which, since Sept 1998, has had a factory fitted insurance approved Thatcham 2 immobiliser. (Source <https://vansecureandinsure.co.uk/vans-with-thatcham-fitted/peugeot.htm>). The policy cover should be carefully reviewed to make sure you are not in breach of any of the terms.

Personally, I do not feel the need to pay so much for insurance cover and then fit layer on layer of additional equipment to protect them from a potential claim above and beyond what is required in the policy. My policy (with Caravanguard) requires the vehicle to be fitted with a Thatcham approved tracker and an active tracking subscription to be in place. Your Broadway will have the Sargent tracker fitted by Auto-Sleepers and your annual subscription



should be kept renewed annually. On this subject, you will normally have no choice because of the value of the vehicle. So, you already have three main lines of defence and security.

My view is that these three levels, backed up by a habit of securing your keys (including spare keys) at all times, is sufficient. Remember, in the event of a claim for loss, your insurer will require you to produce all the keys originally supplied to demonstrate that you did not allow the thief access to your keys. I also had a spare habitation door key cut and this is hidden outside the vehicle in case we ever get locked out while away with the van. (We have Bourton which self-locks the doors if you have opened then with the remote and then put the keys down inside the van - a "feature" of the Mercedes). This is also a useful backup in case we lose the keys while out enjoying ourselves.

However, If you feel that fitting more security gives you both peace of mind, your options include:

1. A Thatcham approved alarm system

These systems, when fitted by an approved installer can attract a small discount on your insurance premium, but even the most reliable of these can occasionally give rise to false alarms - either by "user error" or electrical / electronic faults. These false triggers will almost certainly be a nuisance and I have experienced the annoyance of a motorhome "sounding off" while the owner is out for the day. I have also anecdotal tales of these alarm systems going off in the night and the noise they make inside the vehicle is, literally, deafening.

2. Steering Locks and wheel clamps

My opinion is that the immobiliser does a much better job without the need to carry these heavy items and go to the trouble of fitting them while parked up and removing them before driving off. Remember, every Kg of security hardware you carry reduces your payload, which is limited.

3. Security post

A security post fitted where you store your motorhome is a very good and convenient additional deterrent to potential thieves. It is visible and can be the focus of any CCTV cameras you might have fitted on your property.

The additional, not so obvious, downside to mechanical security is that if you have the benefit from a discount on your policy for the declared use of these devices and they were not used or fitted, there will be grounds for a claim for loss being rejected on the grounds of negligence. The day you got home in the rain and put off fitting wheel clamps or security post - and the van goes missing, you will be in a world of pain. Fit them by all means, but do not declare them to your insurer. If it appears on your policy you are obliged to use it/them at all times.

As for mirror guards, they can provide protection from many, but not all impacts. They are expensive however, but generally speaking, the more you pay, the

better they are. The offside mirror is most at risk because it is likely to be subject to the combined impact energy of your own vehicle and an oncoming vehicle. Other impacts with stationary objects are likely to be low speed as you manoeuvre close to them. Whatever you choose to fit or not, it is a good idea to fit high visibility stickers to the back of the mirrors to make them more visible to oncoming traffic.

Lastly, and what I intend to fit (when I get around to it) is a flashing blue LED below the offside headlight to make it look like I have an alarm fitted.

At the end of the day, I believe that paying for and fitting additional security only provides protection for the insurer because if a thief is determined, your van will be at risk. These additional things can also get in the way of the intended use of the motorhome and constantly remind you of the danger of leaving it unattended.

Willersey Service Centre costs

I recently checked the current charges at the factory Service Centre.

The current labour costs are £75.00 per hour + Vat.

Habitation checks are £249.00 fully inclusive of Vat.

To obtain the ASOC member discount of 10%, you need to tell the staff that you are an ASOC member and request the discount and produce your valid membership card when booking. You will not qualify if you request the discount after the invoice has been made up with the undiscounted price. The discount also applies to upgrades and accessories such as bike racks, extra solar panels etc.

It is probably worth mentioning, that they do not carry out any mechanical servicing work or Mot's.

Cheltenham Laminating

As many members will know, the GRP body of Auto-Sleepers "Monocoque" motorhomes were produced by Cheltenham Laminating...

Derek Murray at CL says he can now provide DIY repair kits for monocoque motorhomes. Here is one of his kits, which are so new, he has not had a price yet from his supplier.

Exact colour matching a repair may be an issue following a DIY repair and to do larger repairs may need a complete "cutting back" of the GRP surface to remove any dull finish that occurs to the gel coat over the years. This will allow for an accurate colour match. Derek says he is happy to provide that service at their premises. This cutting back process is fairly intensive and will restore the finish very close to "as new", so may be worth considering just to give your motorhome a "lift". For owners that feel that this DIY approach is beyond their abilities, any

repairs or work on their monocoque body or habitation door can be carried out by Cheltenham Laminations.

An additional problem arises in specifying the actual colour that was used when they were originally produced. The colour of your monocoque was arbitrarily chosen and varied van to van during the various production runs. They were never a standard RAL colour. This means that any significant painting of a repair will need the cutting back process on the whole van, after which, a colour match can be made by a paint supplier.

I wrote up a piece, with photographs, detailing a very nice repair to the habitation door lock mechanism which involved modifying the door aperture for the lock. An obsolete and worn-out lock was replaced by a larger brand-new lock. The finished work was completely invisible and the member was delighted. The article can be found on the website in News, No.362 – Nov 2018.
