Auto-Sleeper Owners Club

History of Club

The seeds of starting an Auto-Sleeper Owners Club were first sewn back in 1988 when John Cox, had a favourable response from Auto-Sleepers Limited of Willersey, near Broadway to the idea. John then had a letter published in the “Motorcaravan & Motorhome Monthly” suggesting that a club for people who owned an Auto-Sleeper motorhome might prove popular. The response was such, that the wheels were put in motion. Auto-Sleepers Director, Mr Charles Trevelyan, helped to establish an acting committee, constitution and rules.

The first National Rally took place in April 1989 where 230 vans attended. The membership by then totalled around 650 people. A monthly newsletter was produced and rallies began, where members exchanged ideas and enjoyed themselves. As these became more popular the club developed further by creating a Club Website, Regalia sales and a Technical Group to help and advise fellow club members. The President, Charles Trevelyan has been involved with the club from its inception up to present day.

Today, we still hold our National Rally and AGM at the beginning of May at the Newark Showground, where we hold an annual raffle and stalls to raise funds for charity. There is also evening entertainment and bookable meals. Rally marshals still host rallies that are popular with the members.

INFORMATION ABOUT RALLIES

At the recent National and AGM, I was asked about rallies. Here’s a brief explanation of what we do.

Auto-Sleeper Owners Club (Cont)

What is a rally?

The objective of our group is to organize rallies throughout the year for the enjoyment of all members of the Auto-Sleeper Owner's Club. These rallies are hosted by club members who volunteer their time to book sites in locations that may be of interest to you.

However, the common bond between us all is that we own an Auto-Sleeper Motorhome, whether it be a motorhome, campervan or a panel van, in all different sizes and enjoy travelling the country and exploring areas where we may never have been before.

Who attends a club rally?

Our membership is spread across England, Wales, Scotland, and Ireland.

We consist of individuals who share an interest in motorhoming and enjoy attending rallies organized by the rally marshals of our club.

Our members come from various professional and commercial backgrounds. We have members who are currently working, retired, or living independently.

When and where are rallies held?

Rallies are held throughout the year at a variety of locations found by members in the UK and in Europe and have a minimum of fresh water and toilet emptying facility. You can attend the rally for the duration of the rally, or you can choose fewer nights, the choice is yours.

Auto-Sleeper Owners Club (Cont)

There are different kind of rallies:

- The annual National and AGM are held at the beginning of May at Newark Show Ground. During this rally, there is evening entertainment and evening meals, which can be pre-ordered when applying to attend. Regalia items are available for sale, and donations are requested for teas and coffee. There is also a tombola, stalls, and a raffle, with all proceeds going towards the charity supported that year.
- Other rallies with entertainment coincide with National Motorhome Shows.
- Rallies can take place on commercial sites that offer complete facilities such as electric hook-ups, toilets, and shower blocks.
- Some rallies are identified as greenfield sites and take place at football/ rugby clubs, school playing fields, in National Parks, and sometimes aerodromes. These rallies typically provide fresh water and a clearly marked Chemical Disposal Point (Elsan).
However, some of these sites do allow access to showers and toilets.

Regardless of which type of rally site you are on waste water should be emptied at a designated disposal point. If there are none on site, then pour the water around the hedges. Please do not let the waste water discharge directly onto your pitch. Rubbish should be placed in the bins provided or taken home for disposal.

The number of attendees at the rallies can range from 15 to 50 vans, depending on the capacity permitted by the site. Unlike the National Rally, these rallies have fewer participants, allowing for more personal interactions and socialisation. There is typically a bus stop located outside or near the site, providing convenient access to neighbouring towns.

What happens at a rally?

Typically there is a welcome meet and greet on the first evening where there will be refreshments, and an end of event get together again with a cuppa or something a little stronger.

Auto-Sleeper Owners Club (Cont)

During the daytime, individuals typically engage in leisure activities and explore the surrounding area. Optional activities such as walks, coach or boat trips, or group visits may be organized by the marshal, but participation is not mandatory. Additionally, the marshal hosting the event may offer competitions, quizzes, raffles, or games throughout the duration of your stay, though participation in these activities is also voluntary.

Activities may include a group BBQ, meals, fish and chip suppers, or just chilling and chatting. The primary goal is to provide an enjoyable experience with others who have similar interests. Participation in activities is entirely voluntary; you can engage in as many or as few as you prefer without any obligation.

How much do rallies cost?

The prices vary depending on the venue. There is a non-refundable rally fee that covers rally plaques, refreshments, and sometimes prizes for quizzes or a raffle, as decided by the marshal. Greenfield sites are generally less expensive, and marshals can often negotiate a special rate when rallying at a commercial site.

Who are the rally marshals?

Rally marshals, who oversee the rallies, are dedicated club members who have volunteered their time to organize and manage the event. Upon arrival, please report to the marshal's van, which will be clearly marked. You will then be directed to your designated parking area.

Our marshals are dedicated to making our rallies inclusive and ensuring a positive experience for all participants. If it is your first rally, other members will assist you.

How to book rallies?

Details of all rallies are available at www.asoc.uk.com in the members area. You can view rallies and apply online by clicking the advertisement link. Alternatively, fill out the form online, print it, and mail it with your cheque to the address quoted, you will receive a confirmation email. Remember to keep a copy of your application for reference.

A very pleasant campsite close to Rutland Water

On our way up to the ASOC National in Newark which has just ended, we stopped for three nights at The Lodge Trust Country Park in Market Overton, Rutland on their Camping and Caravan Club CS (They also have a CAMC CL on the same site).

The CS has two hard standing pitches and three grass pitches. The CL has 5 hard standing pitches. All CL and CS pitches have 10A electric hook-up. Pitches cost £20 per night in Summer and £25 per night in Winter until 1st April. We preferred the CS as it was quieter – the variety of bird songs was amazing. The site is only a ten minute drive from Rutland Water during which you pass the famous Barnsdale Garden of Geoff Hamilton and BBC Gardeners World fame.



Rutland Water has several car parks around its circumference so you don't need to walk the full 25 miles around the reservoir in one go. We also took a 40 minute boat ride on the Rutland Belle, which visited the partially submerged Normanton Church.

We highly recommend this CL, where coincidentally, ASOC members Barb and Al (of St Ives fame) Buckett arrived shortly after us. We assumed that they would be joining us at Newark, but in fact they were en route for their 500 mile trip around Scotland !

The Lodge Trust is a home for adults with learning disabilities and the residents and staff who we met were all extremely friendly and eager to chat to us without being intrusive. There is also a cafe on site which serves food all day until 4.00pm - their bacon and brie baguette was our particular favourite. A very quiet and peaceful setting with lots of interest.

Government extends ban on personal meat imports to protect farmers from foot and mouth

Ban on personal imports of meat and dairy products extended to cover all EU countries to safeguard the UK food system and farmers against foot and mouth disease

The Government has taken measures to prevent the spread of foot and mouth disease (FMD) following a rising number of cases across Europe.

From (Saturday 12th April), travellers will no longer be able to bring cattle, sheep, goat, and pig meat, as well as dairy products, from EU countries into Great Britain for personal use, to protect the health of British livestock, the security of farmers, and the UK’s food security.

This includes bringing items like sandwiches, cheese, cured meats, raw meats or milk into Great Britain – regardless of whether it is packed or packaged or whether it has been bought at duty free.

Maintaining good biosecurity is essential to protecting the health and welfare of herds and critical to preventing the spread of diseases such as FMD and preventing an outbreak spreading.

 - **Why?** The rear lounge or dinette area will get **morning shade** and **evening sun**, ideal for relaxing at the end of the day.
 - Keeps bedroom and living areas cooler overnight.
 - Allows awning use in the afternoon without full sun exposure.
- 2. Back to the Prevailing Wind (Usually South-West in the UK):**
 - Reduces wind chill on the main door side.
